One Planet Market is held on the 3rd Saturday of each month at Payneham Community Centre. Established in 2011, it continues as a project of volunteer organisation Sustainable Communities SA Inc.

The market has many regular customers and stall holders who value it highly. However, over the past 2 years, COVID, the Fruit Fly outbreak, Eastern Health Authority requirements, and the retirement of some long term volunteers have made an impact.

We are seeking a new Coordinator to bring fresh energy, ideas and new volunteers to grow and rejuvenate the market. The Coordinator will take overall responsibility for the continuation and strengthening of the market.

- Maintain the hire arrangements for Payneham Community Centre Hall and Park including insurance, room bookings and keys
- Ensure public safety
- Recruit and welcome new stall holders that align with our market, maintain connection with current stall holders
- Liaise with LETS stall holders and Repair Cafe
- Liaise with the Workshop Coordinator who organises presentations on sustainability topics
- Recruit new volunteers and support current volunteers
- Ensure volunteers running the market are able to cover all tasks
- Opening and closing, transport and erection of signs, banners and flags
- SCSA stalls - information, tea and coffee, swap and share and Freecycle
- Advertising - social media, newsletter
