CES WEBSITE HINTS & TIPS

Need some help with the CES website? Please ask us for help if you need it (letsadelaide@gmail.com), but there are also self-help options on the website if you are interested to click about yourself. At the top right hand side of the page you will see the "Help (?)" button, which contains lots of useful Frequently Asked Questions and website instructions. Some useful tips below:

Remember that in CES, it's the seller that enters the transaction. Under the "Trading" heading, there is the option to enter a single transaction, or multiples at once, such as if you have traded with many members at the OPM.

Looking for a member in CES? At the very top right of the page, you will see a "User" field. You can type part of someone's name, or simply their number, and it will locate the member quickly for you.

You also don't have to wait for the monthly Offerings & Wants emails to come out, you can look them up any time on CES! At the top are the "Offerings" and "Wants" headings, you can click through and then view on latest offerings, search for something specific, or even view offerings on other exchange systems.


One Planet Market at Payneham
