We thought it worthwhile to clarify how the market operates. Non LETS stall holders who charge in cash pay \$5 per month for a stall, whereas LETS stall holders get their stall for free because our LETS Admin account pays for your stalls on your behalf to promote LETS.

We co-orodinate our LETS stalls but the market is overall organised bv Sustainable Communities **LETS** (a member) and is run entirely volunteers. One of our members. Monica. has volunteered in the key role of Market Coordinator for many years and has recently stepped down. The great news is that Bibi Medved has stepped up.
