## **NEW MEMBER TRADING TIPS**

We are so happy to welcome lots of new members recently. Everyone would have received the initial welcome letter with instructions on how to log into the online CES system and access your account. Sometimes it's a bit overwhelming to take in everything, so here are a few tips to get your trading adventures off to a good start!

- Sometimes new members don't have a quick response to their initial offer, especially if it's something particular which others don't have a use for at this tilme.
- Other members O&W may suggest other listings you could offer. Don't be put off if others have the same offer. Everyone does things differently and its great to have choices. Remember to always have at least one offering listed.
- Did you see the part in your welcome letter letting you know that new members don't need
  to earn units before they are able to spend, however we do ask you to be mindful that as a
  new member you have a debit limit of 50 units. Once you have made some contributions to
  the system your account debit limit will be raised to 200 units in line with all active
  members.
- You could browse our Wants listings perhaps you may have something that someone else is looking for, or be able to provide a service to someone.
- Once you have put your Offers onto the CES website, you can repeat them on our Adelaide LETS Members facebook page with added pictures. Often you get a quick response here, whereas your offer may have been 'lost' in the long list of all members offers.
- Think about having a market stall or come to a catchup with any goods and services you
  may like to publicise. This is a great way to get to know other members. You may discover
  new friends with similar interests.

The workshop at the October market was presented by Gina and Rosa from Slow Food SA. They gave us a run down of the history and philosophy behind slow food - eat local and appreciate the time and knowledge that has gone into good food production. They suggested some excellent ways to avoid food waste by creating amazing recipes "leftovers". Some wonderful ideas using fruit peels include mandarin dust and bacon. dolmades banana usina nasturtium leaves instead of vine leaves and pickled nasturtium buds instead of caper berries. We also got to try some delicious treats made from the citrus peel you would normally throw away squeezing juice. A fun informative session enjoyed by all. Gina and Rosa will be back to present again in 2023.
